Maths:

Oral Maths -

- Practice counting forwards and backwards in ones from 1-150 starting at different numbers. This can do this while doing jumping jacks, star jumps etc to make it more fun. Play 'Knock out' number.
 - Count forwards and backwards in tens starting on the decuple (e.g. 40, 50, 60, 70) and off the decuple (e.g. 38, 48, 58, 68)
 - Ask your child what is one more than/one less than ___; what is ten more or ten less than ____.
 - Practice saying number bonds to ten (1+9, 2+8, 3+7 etc)
 - Play hit the button games topmarks.co.uk to reinforce the above work.
- **Sums:** Do 3 sums every day. This week the focus can be on the following type of sum

$$8+6 = 4 + \underline{\quad} \quad 12+5 = 5 + \underline{\quad}, \quad 15+3 = 11+\underline{\quad}$$

Explain that the equals sign is like a balance...or a see saw. We must have the same amount on both sides...

- **Topic (to be done over 2 weeks) : Money 2: Use real coins (1c-20c)**
- Check your child can recognise, sort and name the coins 1c,2c,5c,10c
 - Make sets of various amounts using the above coins (no higher than 20c). Ask your child what coins are in the set and what is the value of the coins.
 - Ask your child to make various amounts (no higher than 20c) for example 18c. Ask them what is the least number of coins needed to make 18c.
 - Make a pretend shop using items from home (keep items in shop under 20c). Play shopkeeper to reinforce adding amounts and also encourage them to figure out the change from 20c.
 - Complete p71-73 in Busy at Maths book.

- Complete a Maths Challenge 1 Test weekly if they have the book at home.

English:

Go to www.nessy.com

On the right side of the page there will be a box 'log in for all nessy programs'.

Click on this. It will bring you to a page asking for your secret word. The word is **MODERNCLAM** for Ms Kilgallons class and **LIMEVIKING** for Ms Higgins class. Tick the box 'remember me' for future log ins.

It will bring you to a page saying 'enter your real name to find your Nessy.'

Just type in your first name, (don't forget the capital letter) and click **GO**.

Your full name will then appear underneath. Click this and you are in.

- Oxford Owl are offering free access to all of their e-books (tablet-friendly 😊) All you have to do is google 'Oxford Owl' and set up an account for free! Aim to read 2 books a week from this site. You can read the same book 2 days in a row to see if you have improved. If you feel the books are too hard or too easy you can move up or down a level.

Writing:

- Creative writing: Chose from one of the following story starters and finish the story:
 1. I got an email from the Easter bunny and he said...
 2. I found a magic wand in my Easter basket and I...
 3. Easter would be different if a dragon hid the eggs because...
- Procedure writing - How to decorate an Easter cake. Use bossy verbs at the start of each sentence e.g. Spread, sprinkle, put, place, cut, pour, enjoy.
