Jobs for Everybody:

(Children: You choose what jobs you want to do each day, try to get all the jobs done by Friday)

*Change your **calendar** every day. Remember the month and season changes on Friday

Ask- Day Date Month Season Year Time Weather

*How did you get on making up your own **school rules**?

Were there any naughty ones??

*Go for a **nature walk**- Name all the birds you see. Watch out, the swallows maybe back from Africa.

*Walk /Run your **daily mile** every day that you can. Keep count of your distance and see how far you travelled

I did 4km everyday can you work out what I walked in 7 days? How many kms did you do ?

Will you send your distances to me so I can pin how far we got on a map of Ireland?

It's 302km (188miles) to Dublin from Cork.

*Do **Active Home Week activities and write it on your sheet**. Everyday. You need to exercise for at least 60 mins everyday. Mr Hurley will be giving a cert to every child who sends back their timesheet.

*Learn a **new skill** this week (how to tie your lace, tie a button on a shirt, Hoover, make a cuppa)

***Play** a board game or card game with your family (I'm playing Go Fish this week)

***Read** a story or a chapter of a book each day

Use your own books or sign up to a free site like vooks.ie or/and oxford tree.co.uk

Send me a picture of the book cover you read via email.

*Watch **School Hub** everyday on RTE2 or on the RTEplayer

Tell me the best thing that was on each day

Did anyone upload your own video to the programme?

*Watch an **Irish** cartoon on TG4 (just to keep the music of the language in your brain)

***Bake/** or make something each week
